COURSE DESCRIPTION:

5. Participants will be able to recognize, understand, and describe why e-cigarettes are more addictive than regular cigarettes.

6. Participants will be able to recognize, understand, and describe how e-cigarette companies target youth.

7. Participants will be able to recognize, understand, and describe why e-cigarettes are not useful as smoking cessation devices.
